Passage 1 • Questions 1-20

- A. The world is facing an exceptional biodiversity issue, with one million species at risk of extinction. Among the most vulnerable are animals that are about to disappear off the planet because habitat loss, hunting, pollution, and climate change. These endangered animals play important roles in the ecosystems, and their loss would have devastating results for earth.
- B. One of the main threats to endangered animals is habitat loss. As human populations expand and their activities increase, natural habitats are being destroyed at a shocking rate. Forests are cleared for agriculture and development, wetlands are drained for land use, and rivers are polluted by industrial waste. These changes are preventing endangered animals from finding food, shelter, and breeding grounds they need to survive.
- C. Hunting is also a major threat to endangered animals. Some species are hunted for their meat, fur, or ivory, while others, like rare birds, are illegally caught to be sold as pets. The demand for these products is driven by luxury markets, traditional medicine practices, and the exotic pet trade. The illegal wildlife trade is a multi-billion-dollar industry that is causing serious destruction to endangered species populations.
- D. Pollution is another major threat to endangered animals. Toxic chemicals from industrial waste, water from farms and fields, and urban pollution are polluting ecosystems and harming wildlife. These pollutants can cause cancer, birth defects, and other health problems in animals. They can also affect food chains and harm the reproductive systems of endangered species.
- E. Climate change is worsening the threats faced by endangered animals. Rising temperatures, changing rainfall patterns, and extreme weather events are examples of climate change that are negatively affecting ecosystems and making it difficult for animals to survive. As a result of climate change, some species are being forced to travel to new habitats, while others are struggling to continue living under these changing conditions.
- F. The loss of endangered animals would have devastating consequences for the planet. Animals play very important roles in ecosystems, providing food, keeping soil in good health, and other services that are essential to human well-being. Their extinction would disrupt food chains, reduce biodiversity, and weaken the stability of ecosystems.
- G. There are many things we can do to protect endangered animals. We can support conservation organizations, promote sustainable practices, and reduce our consumption of products that contribute

to habitat loss and pollution. We can also educate others about the importance of protecting endangered species and encourage them to take action.
